Bibles for Belize: Easter–Pentecost 2011

The Bishop and the Companion Diocese Committee are pleased to introduce another aspect of our companion relationship with the Diocese of Belize. During the Great Fifty Days of Easter, we are challenging the Diocese of Eastern Newfoundland and Labrador to give money to help buy Bibles for the students of Belize. On his last visit, Bishop Pitman was shocked to learn that the Anglican high school in Belize City had to share just three Bibles amongst the entire student population! This is obviously something that we as a diocese can quickly and easily do something about. A copy of the Bible in Belize, available through the United Bible Societies (of which our Canadian Bible Society is a part) is equivalent to just \$15 Canadian. Just imagine how quickly we could make a difference! The Bible is the greatest gift we can share, especially with those who have no access. If you would like to help contribute, your donation, marked 'Bibles for Belize' can be made through your local parish between now and June 12th.

The Chaplaincy Dept of St. Claire's is recruiting volunteers for the Eucharistic Ministry Program at both St. Claire's and the Miller Center. Essentially the time commitment currently is 2 hours every 5th Sunday. At St. Claire's it's between 9-11 am on Sundays and at the Miller Center it's between 12:30 and 2:30 pm. Oftentimes the Eucharistic Ministers are finished before the 2 hour timeframe. As well, the more volunteers that we have, then the less frequent the volunteers will be required. They would have to follow the Eastern Health orientation program.

ANNUAL HOLOCAUST MEMORIAL SERVICE

2 PM SUNDAY AFTERNOON, MAY 1

BRUNEAU CENTRE, MEMORIAL UNIVERSITY

The Atlantic Jewish Council and the Jewish Community Havura of Newfoundland and Labrador invite you to the Annual Holocaust Memorial Service at 2 pm Sunday afternoon, May 1, at the Bruneau Centre for Research and Innovation (formerly the Inco Innovation Centre), on the Memorial University campus.

The service will focus on **Remembrance and Responsibility**: remembering those who died and their rich culture -- and our responsibility to prevent genocide from happening to any people ever again.

The program will include the lighting of seven candles – for the six million Jews who perished and a seventh for other victims of the Holocaust, and the reading of names of family members of local Jewish families who were killed during the Holocaust. Jonathan Richler will speak about visiting the death camps more than half a century after they were closed by Allied soldiers.

Israeli-born Gil Shalev will talk about his many family members lost in the Holocaust. This year's programme will also feature a celebration of East European Yiddish culture – the culture that the Nazis nearly destroyed – with music and story. Everyone is invited to stay for refreshments following the service.
