St. George's Day Business take-outs will be on April 20th and Community take-outs on April 21st.



Renovation Update:

Work on the interior has begun!! On Thursday a beam was installed on our east wall, materials were removed from the walls of our chapel and we were presented with the first draft of a floor plan for the western side. It is an exciting time for our Church. We need your support to ensure that this project is completed in a timely manner. The end result of this project will include a new chapel in the Southwest Corner, a balcony over the main entrance, a bathroom in the Northwest corner, the vestry will be moved to the Northeast corner and our Choir room will relocated in the Southeast corner. The building will be newly wired, fully insulated and we will have the latest in audio and visual equipment. There will be alterations to our seating and chancel area. The center aisle will be widened and new flooring will be installed. Many thanks for your suggestions: they have assisted us in our planning. On Monday, April 16th at 7pm your renovation team will be hosting an information session on the interior renovation project. This gathering will give us an opportunity to share more detailed information on the plan and to ask for further input from members our congregation. We look forward to seeing you there.

Lasting Palm Sunday Impression:

Seder Meal

Passover is the oldest and most important religious festival in Judaism, commemorating God's deliverance of the Hebrews from slavery in Egypt and his creation of the Israelite people. The focal point of Passover is a communal meal, called the Seder. It is an elaborate teaching experience, intended to call people to their identity as the People of God. By using all of the senses, the Passover Seder tells the story of God's grace in history and calls the participants to experience and share in the story as their own story. There has been increasing interest among Christians in this ancient festival. There are various reasons for this renewed interest: sensitivity to cultural and societal problems and a corresponding desire to learn about others; a renewed awareness of the importance of the Old Testament Scriptures as Christian Scripture; a desire or even a need in our modern world to recover a sense of the sacred through liturgy and sacrament; the willingness to find new and innovative ways to worship; and perhaps even the enjoyment that comes from acknowledging the continuity with a 3,000 year old community of faith. On Thursday, April 5th the ACW will be hosting a Seder Meal beginning at 5:00pm in our Parish Hall. Tickets are \$8.00 each and may be purchased by calling Barb Tilley at 834-4795
