The HMP Chaplaincy is spearheading a new program at the prison this fall. It is to enable inmates who are fathers to be recorded reading bedtime stories to their children. The stories will then be copied to a DVD and sent to their children. It is so important for little ones to have the night-time contact with a parent that all children desire. The fathers are given the book for a week to practice and then read aloud the story in the presence of a chaplain, who will record it.
