CHRISTIAN EDUCATION AND SPIRITUAL GROWTH

EASTER celebrates the central event of our Christian faith: the resurrection of Jesus Christ three days after his death by crucifixion. The Apostle Paul said that if Jesus Christ has not been resurrected then the Christian faith is worthless and futile (1 Cor. 15:14-17). Therefore, without Easter there is no Christianity.

Today we celebrate the oldest Christian holiday and the most important day of our church year. Easter is the oldest Christian holiday and the most important day of the church year. What do eggs have to do with Easter? Over the centuries, Easter Sunday has been supplemented by popular customs, many of which were incorporated from springtime fertility celebrations of European and Middle Eastern pagan religion. Rabbits and eggs, for example, are widely used pagan symbols for fertility.

Easter eggs, are sometimes viewed as symbols of joy and celebration and as a "taste" of the new life and resurrection that we have in Jesus Christ.

Worship

PRAYER Do you believe that our God is a God of second chances? Well, actually, the Bible tells us that our God is very generous in His forgiveness. Remember the prostitute who would be stoned? Jesus recognized that she had sinned many times but, He told her to go and 'sin no more'. Remember St. Peter? He denied Jesus, not once, but three times. And what did Jesus tell the disciples about forgiveness? Jesus said that we are to forgive our debtors not seven times, but 77 times (Mathew 18:22). IF Jesus expects us to forgive our neighbours 77 times, you can rest assured that GOD is far more capable of forgiving us in greater numbers than this!! SO, when you fall into sin: 1) Feel sorry for your mistakes; 2) Pray to God for forgiveness; 3) Pledge to try not to fall into sin again (with GOD's help); 4) And, trust in God's ability to wash off all the stains left on you by your sin.

One of the writers in **Our Daily Bread**, Dennis J. De Hann, says that one of the major drawbacks of being human is that our regret and feeling of unworthiness of God's forgiveness keeps us down and causes us to not be able to move ahead in our spiritual life. He says that our GOD is the God of 'second chances'. **Truly, I tell you, Our GOD is a God of unlimited chances IF you truly are trying to sin more more!!!**

God forgave Abraham when he lied about Sarah being his sister rather than his wife, when the Pharaoh asked him. (Gen. 12: 11-17)

God blessed Jacob even though he cheated Esau out of their father's blessing. Gen. 27: (18-29)

God still delivered His people into the promised land even when Moses disobeyed Him by striking the rock instead of speaking to it. (Heb. 11:39)

Everyone in the Bible, who sinned against God, who repented and then turned back to God, who pegged His forgiveness, who believed in Jesus, His son, were lifted up even greater than before. So, again, I beg you to Pray and Pray often. Make Prayer a daily part of your very life. Anyone who Prays to GOD will not be abandoned.
