## Rector's Remarks



Will you be my Valentine?

Just recently I received a package from my mother. She, like other mothers, likes to keep reminders of her children. Apparently she had kept every Valentine's Day card I had ever received as a child, so when I open the package I found myself reading the Valentine's Day cards I received when I was in grade 2 & 3. Nostalgic! Seeing names on the cards, faces popped into my mind. I can only guess what they look like now.

My guess is that at one time or another we each have bought or made a card for someone. I had not thought of the importance of these cards, these reminders of love until I went further into the package my mother had sent. Not only had she kept all the Valentine's Cards I had received, but she had kept every card I had sent to her over the years. I found it interesting to read what a ten, twenty and thirty year old me had written.

Writing letters has always been important to me. In fact, I proposed to Wendy in a letter. My favorite Valentine's Cards I have ever sent her were hand made. Through the cards and letters I have sent over the years I have been able to speak of the love I have felt for those closest to me. It helps to remind me of the importance effort goes into making any relationship work. This includes our relationships with parents, spouse, children or friends. It also includes our relationships within the Church.

I don't know if you have ever thought of scripture this way, but did not God write each of us a Love Letter, as found within the pages of our Bibles. There is one part of this love letter that I believe fits into this week coming. It is found in the Gospels of Matthew and Mark, known as the Summary of the Law. 'Love the Lord your God with all your heart, mind, soul and strength and love your neighbor as yourself.' He wanted each of us to know the depth of the love God has for each of us. He also wanted us to know that he expects us to express this same love to those who are our neighbors. We practice this symbolically each Sunday as we exchange the peace of Christ with each other.

Perhaps, the next time you pick up your Bible, you can look for that love letter to you. I know it is there. You can almost hear God saying to you through its words, 'Will you be my Valentine?
