### Shining a Light on What's Happening in Our Parish

# **Rector's Remarks**

Today marks the Baptism of our Lord. It also represents an opportunity for renewal.

Baptism is an action of God, what our Church calls a Sacrament. It is where the living presence of Jesus Christ is found through someone being presented to. In Paul's letter to the Romans, Paul will describe Baptism as being buried with Christ at his crucifixion and being raised into new life of the resurrection. In every sense of the word, Baptism is a gift from God, in which by our actions, and God's presence through the Waters of Baptism, we are saying that the child we present is a child of God.

Quoting from our Prayer Book in its explanation of Baptism, "Baptism is the sign of new life in Christ. Baptism unites Christ with his people. That union is both individual and corporate. Christians are, it is true, baptized one by one, but to be a Christian is to be part of a new creation which rises from the dark waters of Christ's death into the dawn of his risen life. Christians are not just baptized individuals; they are a new humanity.

The scriptures of the New Testament and the liturgy of the Church unfold the meaning of baptism in various images (often based on Old Testament water symbols) which express the mystery of salvation. Baptism is participation in Christ's death and resurrection (Romans 6.3–5; Colossians 2.12); a washing away of sin (1 Corinthians 6.11); a new birth (John 3.5); an enlightenment by Christ (Ephesians 5.14); a reclothing in Christ (Galatians 3.27); a renewal by the Spirit (Titus 3.5); the experience of salvation from the flood (1 Peter 3.20–21); an exodus from bondage (1 Corinthians 10.1–2) and a liberation into a new humanity in which barriers of division, whether of sex or race or social status, are transcended (Galatians 3.27–28; 1 Corinthians 12.13). The images are many but the reality is one.<sup>1</sup>

Today, as we celebrate the Baptism of Jesus, we have opportunity to renew our own baptism promises that were made at our own baptism and confirmed at our Confirmation. As we are marked as Christ's own, I do encourage you, to stand during the Baptism service, immediately after the examination of the candidates (pg 154), I will address the congregation asking if you seem to renew your commitment to Jesus Christ (pg 155). The Baptismal Covenant, which is always said by all within the congregation, will have special meaning, for you are seeking to renew something that already exists. At the time of Communion, as you come forward toward the Altar Rail, I do encourage you to dip your finger(s) or thumb into the water in the lower font, and to mark a cross on your forehead, saying the words, "I am signed with the sign of the cross and marked at Christ's own forever."

Allow the emotions as you do this, the action of the invisible cross on your forehead, the prayers that are offered during this service and the gifts of bread and wine to be renewal of your own baptismal commitment to Christ. And may, through our worship, and your action, each of us be aware of the tremendous love God has for each of us, this day and always.
