Sunday, January 29, 2017 Shining a Light on What's Happening in Our Parish

Rector's Remarks

Sunday, January 22nd, I had the pleasure accompanying our confirmation class as we visited our Cathedral. 12 members of the confirmation class were present plus about 10 parents and their teachers and helpers - almost 30 of us. In fact we took up 6 rows of the Cathedral pews.

Bishop Cy, who is the Priest in Charge at the Cathedral at present, warmly welcomed us into the Cathedral. He spoke with glowing words of his seven years he spent as Rector at All Saints. He spoke of the positive impact our parish had on his own ministry.

As a congregation you would have been so proud of our confirmands. They witnessed the formality of the processions (the entrance into the church, the Gospel procession and the procession to the pulpit). They had chance to worship using the Book of Common Prayer. They saw how another choir sings the service. In all things, they fully participated in the worship.

Afterwards, I was so impressed as they engaged in conversation with members of the Cathedral Congregation. When the organist invited them up to play the great and powerful pipe organ, each of them thrilled at their chance to make the rafters ring or to use the foot pedals or to pretend they were a rock musician. After this, they went on a tour of the Cathedral. Rev'd Derrick Bishop, a Deacon of the Cathedral parish, who is the chief guide, led the tour. Towards the end of our stay, we descended into the basement of the Cathedral, a place called the Crypt. The Crypt is carved out of the rock of the Cathedral Foundation. Here we had lunch (pizza) with Bishop Cy joining us for this time of fellowship.

Sometimes, and all of us guilty of this at one time or another, we can convince ourselves that the traditions we follow are the proper and only way of doing things. Our confirmands learned a very important lesson about our church last Sunday. They learned, while worship may be different between churches, traditions will change and the looks of the church will vary, we are assured that when two or three are gathered together in the name of Jesus Christ, worship will take place.

I am pleased to say that at our Cathedral the confirmands from All Saints worshipped God. I am even more pleased to report, the Cathedral Congregation was able to witness the vibrancy of our faith and the reverence we too have in worship.
