Rector's Remarks

"A Samaritan woman came to draw water, and Jesus said to her, 'Give me a drink'. (His disciples had gone to the city to buy food.) The Samaritan woman said to him, 'How is it that you, a Jew, ask a drink of me, a woman of Samaria?' (Jews do not share things in common with Samaritans.) Jesus answered her, 'If you knew the gift of God, and who it is that is saying to you, "Give me a drink", you would have asked him, and he would have given you living water.' The woman said to him, 'Sir, you have no bucket, and the well is deep. Where do you get that living water? Are you greater than our ancestor Jacob, who gave us the well, and with his sons and his flocks drank from it?' Jesus said to her, 'Everyone who drinks of this water will be thirsty again, but those who drink of the water that I will give them will never be thirsty. The water that I will give will become in them a spring of water gushing up to eternal life.' The woman said to him, 'Sir, give me this water, so that I may never be thirsty or have to keep coming here to draw water.'"

So begins one of the most important conversations found anywhere within our Gospels, Jesus in conversation with the woman at the well. In the Gospel reading, we find as Jesus speaks, the woman is, testy, almost belligerent. Her attitude reflects the relationship that existed between Jews and Samaritans at that time. As the conversation continues, the woman discovers that Jesus speaks with authority about the ways of God and that he seems to know everything about her. Despite this great knowledge, he does not stand in judgement of her.

Notice, how at first the woman thinks only about water, water she has drawn from Jacob's well all her life. Soon, though, she realizes that Jesus is pointing beyond the physical water, pointing towards life eternal. Jesus points towards God's great love of each person, a love that flows like a spring, unearned, giving life to all that it touches.

Her conversation with Jesus, while short, is so profound, that she goes back to her own community and tells everyone of this man who knew everything about her. The community, after her telling them, come to visit Jesus. They are captivated by his words, so captivated that they invite Jesus to stay longer, which he does.

Of note, the community where this woman gave her witness of who Jesus was would, after the resurrection become one of the first churches outside of Jerusalem. It would become one of the strongest centers of Christianity for centuries. It became strong because one woman asked questions of God's son and then gave witness to how she found her life changed because of his responses. She proclaimed the Good News.

As a church we can sometimes lose sight of this simple truth that the 'woman at the well' practiced. This being that everything the church does must always ultimately focus on how we proclaim the Good News of Jesus Christ. Jesus used a simple request for a glass of water to help plant one of the foundational churches of our faith. If Jesus used a simple request for a glass of water to help change attitudes of how we view God. Not limited by buildings or by places, but flowing like springs of water, giving life to all it touches.

"I Have Seen the Lord!", A Lenten Quiet Day at the Parish of All Saints with Bishop Geoff Saturday, March 18, 10 a.m. to 2:30 p.m.

You are invited to join Bishop Geoff Peddle and the members of the Parish of All Saints, CBS, in a time of reflection on the words of Mary Magdalene to the Disciples that first Easter morning when, to her great surprise, she encountered Jesus in the garden. In a departure from many Lenten retreats that focus upon the solemn nature of Lent, Bishop Geoff will focus in his three short talks upon the unexpected joy of Easter contained in Mary's proclamation, "I have seen the Lord!" (John 20:18)

The Bishop will begin with a reflection on Mary Magdalene's encounter with our Lord on the Day of Resurrection, reminding us that it was to Mary that Jesus revealed himself first of all. However, Mary's special place in Jesus' life was clear long before then and the mystery of their love continues to the present day. Holy Scripture tells us that Jesus cast seven demons out of Mary and from that time she followed him and was present at his Crucifixion. Criticized by some as sinful because of her past, it is clear from scripture that Jesus did not regard her as fallen and deeply loved this woman. It was Mary Magdalene who first told the disciples "I have seen the Lord," leading some to call her "the Apostle to the Apostles."

Bishop Geoff will reflect upon Mary's journey of faithfulness and healing and what it means for us personally in our walk with Christ. The Bishop will consider Jesus' constant love for Mary, made perfect in her brokenness and what it means for us as members of his Church. Calling Mary Magdalene a "Saint for our Time," he will offer Mary's story of faithfulness as a roadmap for the Christian Church in an age of disbelief. Claiming that individuals and churches sometimes get "stuck" at Good Friday and never move to Easter, the Bishop will show that by truly embracing Mary's story we become "Easter People" for the world!

Quiet time for prayer between each talk is planned. Music & hymns will add to the day. The outline is as follows:


