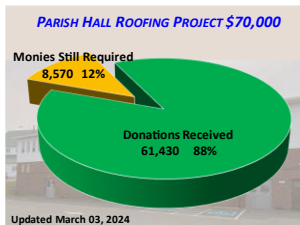

RENEWAL OF ORDINATION VOWS - On Maundy Thursday, we gather with our fellow clergy to renew our commitment to serve Christ and his people through our ordination vows. However, let us not forget that the ministry of Christ is not limited to the ordained, but it includes all of us through our baptism. This year we will celebrate our baptismal ministry by **including the ministry of Lay People with a License for ministry in our Diocese**. Our Licensed Lay Ministers

and Eucharistic Assistants will also have the opportunity to renew their commitment to their ministry in Christ's Church. Join us on **Thursday, March 28, at 10:30 am at our Cathedral** - everyone is invited to robe.

Healthcare Chaplaincy



The hospital chaplaincy is funded by the Diocese of Eastern Newfoundland and Labrador through the parish assessment. There are two full-time Chaplains serving the hospitals in the St. John's area, with responsibility to Pleasant View Towers. Our weekend Chaplain

is only doing pager service from Thursday at 5:00 pm to Sunday at 7:00 am.

If patients are registered as an "ANGLICAN" the chaplains will be seeing them at least every second day while they are in the hospitals. Family members may not always see the chaplain because their visiting is done in the morning or early afternoon before the families are allowed to visit.

If you need to see the chaplains, please ask the nurse to page them on your behalf. Arrangements will be made to set up a time to meet with you.

If your loved is not seen while in the hospital, then they are on a list known as "*No Pastoral Care*". If the patient cannot do the changes from "*No Pastoral Care*" to "Anglican" then the next of kin is responsible to make that change. The Clergy cannot visit if the patient is on the "*No Pastoral Care List*" due the law of confidentiality.

No clergy can share any information with anyone unless it is the next of kin - including the Parish Priest.

The hospitals are really the parish for the two chaplains, and your priest is constantly in touch with us if a patient is admitted. After seeing the specific patient, we will contact him with any message regarding that patient's condition.

This research project brings together academics from Canada, Germany, Poland and Ireland. Its aim is to understand the transformations of religions during the Covid-19 pandemic. It has received the support of The Canadian Council of Churches, the Table de concertation interreligieuse du Québec, the Assembly of Quebec Catholic Bishops, and the Canadian Centre for Ecumenism, that are working in partnership with Professor Solange Lefebvre to distribute the questionnaire.
