The Fifteenth Lambeth Conference, Canterbury, England

The Archbishop of Canterbury, Archbishop Justin Welby, announced a call to prayer for the fifteenth Lambeth Conference, Canterbury, England on July 26th-August 8th. The call to prayer invites people to devote a day to prayer on Trinity Sunday, June 12th and to pray for the event in the weeks ahead. The Archbishop of Canterbury says: "The Lambeth Conference theme of 'God's Church for God's World', reminds us that we are called upon as Christians to pray for the needs of the world. There are many calls upon our prayers at this time: world peace, the global climate crisis, the effects of the pandemic, to name but a few."

Every bishop of the Anglican Communion is invited, which is convened by the Most Rev. Justin Welby, the Archbishop of Canterbury. The Lambeth Conference has met since 1867, happens once a decade and is a significant event in the life of the Anglican Communion. The conference will explore church and world affairs. Outcomes of the conference will shape the life of the Anglican Communion in the decade ahead.

Prayer from the Archbishop of Canterbury

It is my prayer that, inspired by the Holy Spirit, the Lambeth Conference will reinvigorate the Communion with vision and resources to bring the transforming love of Jesus to every level of society across the world. It will be a time of addressing hurts and concerns; of deepening existing relationships and building new ones; of grappling with issues that face the church and the world. We will listen to each other; we will seek God's wisdom to find ways to walk together; we will build each other up as leaders. Amen
