The Son of Man must be lifted up, that whoever believes in Him may have eternal life.

John 3: 14-15

Scripture Readings:

• Genesis 12: 1-4

• Psalm 121

• Romans 4: 1-5, 13-17

• John 3: 1-17

Abram trusted God and always looked to Him for guidance. Nicodemus believed Jesus to be a teacher sent by God, but unable to believe Him to be the Messiah.
