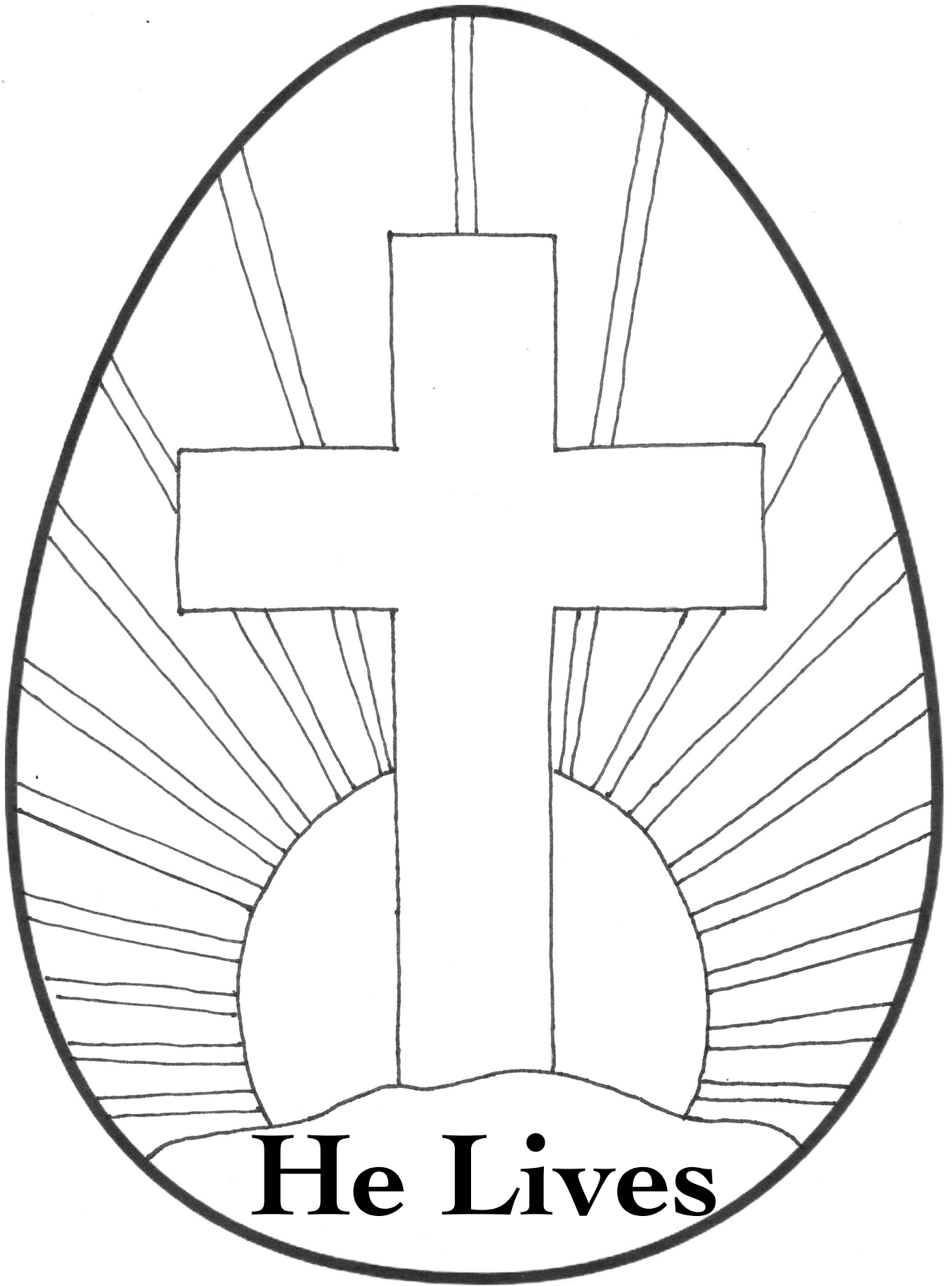

On Easter Sunday the tomb was empty and Jesus was alive.
